Kristin Vandivier, 2613 South Boulevard – On September 4, 2010 her two cats were mauled on her property by two large dogs that were running at large. Both cats suffered broken bones and lacerations and went to Urgent Care. Her friend called the Police, who tracked down the dogs. The dog owner had previously been cited in April 2010 for allowing her dogs to run at large and for killing a cat. This irresponsible dog owner lives across from a park and she worries the dogs could attack a small child or pet. She has spoken with the owner of the dogs to pay for medical bills and may have to file a civil suit. Kettering follows Ohio State Code. She thinks the City should consider adopting a vicious dog ordinance.

Mr. Schwieterman responded the City of Kettering follows Ohio State Code regarding vicious dogs. He will look into this further.

Mayor Patterson thanked Ms. Vandivier for coming to the meeting to express her concerns.

Mr. Klepacz – Last week he attended the Kiwanis Police Officer of the Year dinner. Detective Regina Bier received this year's award for Police Officer of the Year. He congratulated Detective Bier on receiving this award.

Mrs. Schrimpf – She wished Vice Mayor Klepacz a Happy Birthday. On September 16, 2010 the Board of Community Relations held their annual tenant forum.
