We anticipate work beginning in late winter/early spring on Oak Park, Van Buren, Wenzler and Kennedy. A few of the changes you will see next year include new playgrounds, walking trails and shelters. A special addition to Kennedy Park will be the splash pad which features interactive water features.

We are also working with architects on the plans for the Kettering Recreation Complex and water park. We expect construction to begin on these facilities in late summer. FAIR SHARE POLICY

The Kettering resident or person working in Kettering makes a significant contribution to the financing and operation of the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Department. The City property tax and income tax are paid whether or not the individual participates or uses the facilities of the department. The fair share concept is intended to apportion to non-residents an equalized fee, so that they contribute to the overall financing of the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Department on an equitable basis with the resident. It is hoped that this policy will give not only equitable treatment, but also a better understanding of fees and overall financing to both residents and non-residents. FACILITY RENTALS

The Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Department makes many of its facilities available for rent. Consider these possibilities when planning your group's meeting, party, retreat or other activity.

- Kettering Recreation Complex and Charles I. Lathrem Senior Center — Consider holding your meeting, private party or reception at the Kettering Recreation Complex or Senior Center. We offer a variety of room sizes. Call 296-2587.
- Group Overnight or After Prom — Bring your group to the KRC for a night of fun. During fall, winter and spring, Fridays are reserved for overnight group rentals of the gym, multipurpose room and meeting rooms. The hours are 11 p.m. Friday to 6 a.m. Saturday. Call 296-2587.
- KRC Gymnasium — Groups may rent half of the gym or the entire gym for a per hour fee. Call 296-2587 and ask for the Fitness/Sports Coordinator.
- KRC Main Pool — The KRC Main Pool may be rented during various hours after open-swim sessions. Rates vary according to residency and group needs. See page 24 or call 296-2587.
- Kettering Ice Arena — The arena is available for rent during various hours. Hours and rates vary. Call 296-258.
- KRC Lockers — Lockers are available for rent. The fee is 25¢ per day or \$24/resident and \$31/non-resident for a one-year locker pass. Call 296-2587.
- Towels — Towels may be rented at the KRC for 50¢ per visit or \$31/resident, \$39/non-resident for a one-year pass. Call 296-2587.
- Rosewood Arts Centre — This facility offers both large and small rooms for rent at a per-hour rate of \$30 to \$45 for residents and \$60 to \$85 for non-residents. The hourly fee for the theatre is \$45 for residents and \$85 for non-residents. Non-profit organizations may qualify for slightly lower rates. In addition, Rosewood offers private studio space for \$70 a month (resident) and \$110 a month (non-resident).
- Rosewood Lockers — Lockers are available for \$10 a month for residents and \$12 a month for non-residents or on a six-month pre-pay plan for \$40 residents and \$50 for non-residents.
- Southdale Center — Kettering residents may rent this facility at 3036 Bellflower (behind Southdale School) for \$45 for the first hour. Each additional hour costs an additional \$20. Rates for non-residents are higher. Call 296-2486 for more information.
- Picnic Shelters — Seven shelters in four Kettering parks may be reserved for use between May 1 and Oct. 1. Shelters must be reserved in person at the Parks Maintenance Center, 3170 Valleywood Drive. A \$25 deposit is required. See page 67 for more information or call 296-2486.
- Picnic Kits — Kits that include a volleyball and net, four badminton rackets, two shuttle cocks, a softball and bat, whiffle football, utility ball, Frisbee and whiffle ball and bat may be rented for your special outing. For more information, call 296-2486.
