Dear Resident,

Investments to infrastructure in your neighborhood are scheduled for the next few years. The City of Kettering is coordinating with Vectren and Montgomery County Environmental Services to promote investments that are thoughtfully planned and successfully implemented. Reference the map on the back of this letter for general locations of work. Additional information is provided below.

Vectren

Vectren has contracted with Fishel to replace gas mains on Shroyer Road, and Miller Pipeline to perform related restoration of the roadway and grass lawns. Work is planned to start in the coming months, and will continue into 2017. If you have questions, please contact Vectren at 800-227-1376, and reference the Shroyer Road pipeline replacement project. Replacement of gas mains on the local neighborhood streets is scheduled for 2017. Vectren will be able to provide more information on this project in the coming months.

Montgomery County Environmental Services (MCES)

MCES has contracted with Underground Utilities to replace water mains. The work is planned to start in the next 1-2 months, and will continue into 2017. The MCES contact is Ken Stewart at 937-781-3051.

City of Kettering

Following the completion of the gas and water work, the City of Kettering will contract for two projects.

1. Shroyer Road, from Stroop Road north to the Oakwood/Dayton city boundary, will experience road construction work in 2017. The work in Kettering will include the repair of curb and curb ramps, as well as resurfacing the asphalt pavement.
2. A roadway repair project is scheduled for 2018 for those local neighborhood streets in need. For this project, repair to the curb, sidewalk, and drive approaches will be assessed to the property owner. Additional details on the assessment process will be mailed to the property owners in 2017. Upon completion of the concrete work, the asphalt pavement will be resurfaced. 
